Friends Group Receives Grant from Lawrence County Tourism

The Tourism office awarded the Friends of Spring Mill State Park \$1,300 to upgrade the doors to the Grissom Memorial. Soon the front doors of the Memorial will have ADA compliant levers to automatically open the heavy doors for those who need assistance entering or exiting the building. This will make this popular attraction at the park more accessible to all our visitors. Thanks to Lawrence County Tourism for awarding us the money for the project and park staff for putting in the hardware to accomplish this much needed upgrade!



New Benches Constructed for Spring Mill Trails

A grant from the Lawrence County Community Foundation provided funds to purchase some materials for benches to be installed along trails at Spring Mill. Ray Robison, a board member for the Foundation hikes a lot at Spring Mill and had noticed that there were very few trails at the park and thought adding benches would be good addition. The Friends group contributed some additional funds and the ingenuity of dedicated Friends member and volunteer Mark Campbell who built the benches stretched the funds from what we thought was enough to cover 2-3 benches

to five new benches for the park.

We also welcome new ideas for items to sell in the stand. Several items are made by our members. John Castrale has made quilt blocks, bird houses, and bee houses. Amy Phillips has made tic-tac-toe games that have been immensely popular. Emily Engstrom makes lovely note cards that continue to sell well. Amber Hill makes leather bracelets, and in the past we've had people donate tatted bookmarks. Dave Ligman has made carpenter bee traps, Pat Merchant made birdhouse kits, and Teena has brought hen and chicks in shoes. If you have an idea of an item you'd be willing to make for the concession stand, please let Teena know. We need to get permission before we sell any new item.

Our best selling item are UV bracelets that we make with beads that change color in sunlight and glow in the dark. Children and adults alike love the magic of the beads and the \$2 price of the bracelets makes them affordable to everyone.

Friends Bylaws Proposed Changes

The Friends of SMSP current bylaws were adopted in 2015. These bylaws call for 7 board members of which 4 must be present to conduct business. One issue in the last two years is having enough board members at some meetings for a quorum. We are proposing to change the bylaws to allow "no more than 11 board members" and a simple majority for a quorum.

Adding more board members will bring in more ideas and may expand our capacity to take on new projects. According to the bylaws, in order to make any change, the proposed change must be presented at a general membership meeting and then voted on at the next scheduled membership meeting.

Since we generally only have a general membership meeting once a year, it would take two years to change the bylaws. However, if we announce to the membership the intent and dates of our board meetings—anyone can attend and provide input. Members are always welcome at our board meetings, but if you wish to provide input to this change to the bylaws, please attend on **Thursday August 30 at** 6:00, or to vote on the change **Thursday, September 27 at 6:00.** Both meetings will be held at the Nature Center—if the weather is nice we meet outside in back, otherwise downstairs in the big room.
