# **CCC Celebration**

The 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the CCC , Civilian Conservation Corps, is being celebrated at Spring Mill on the weekend of June 9-11, 2023!

The Friends wrote a grant to the Indiana Humanities Council to fund some special events to help honor the work that was done by the corps members who served at Spring Mill.

There will be an interpretive hike to view areas where the CCC help create the trails, and picnic areas in the park. There will be a guided kayak tour of the lake. Spring Mill Lake was a major CCC construction project at the park. There will

Friends of Spring Mill received a grant from Lawrence County Tourism to purchase portable cages for the Activity Center to help the staff transport animals when doing off-site programs. The new cages, pictured here with one of the turtles, enable the staff to safely transport, in a lightweight cage, the different animals they use for programs at locations such as at the campground or the back patio of the Activity Center.
